Q. Great finish there. Just walk me through a couple of the highlights, especially 17 and 18.

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, it was an up-and-down round. I felt like I was off to a good start. Kind of made some bogeys in the middle of the round, so it was nice to get that easier birdie on 16 to get one back, and then 17 hit a great shot. It took a big kick. Had a nice 15-footer, and I kind of knew it was in all the way, so that's always nice when you have a crowd here to cheer. On 18, that wind was strong off the right. I hit a great 3-wood going too much to the left, and the left rough is dead, so to be able to come out of it with a birdie -- I would have asked for a par after hitting that tee shot. It was kind of more of a guessing game once you hit that second shot, so to get out of there with birdie was pretty special.

Q. What was the crowd like?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: That 18 tee shot it was pretty full. To see that many people lined up down the right side, you feel like you might be at a Ryder Cup or a major playing in the last group, so that was pretty special, even though they might not really care since they're there for the concert. But it's cool to see that many people.

Q. What do you think is going to be on your mind the most tomorrow?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Just keep playing my game. I've struggled a little bit this year playing in the last group, so it was nice to get it going at the end today. I definitely feel like I learned a lot today. Golf is hard, but tomorrow I'll just keep doing my thing, and if it works out, it works out.

Q. What do you think specifically you learned from those moments this year?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I mean, just doing the little things right. If you can hit it in play and just know how to pitch the ball, that kind of saves you a bunch of shots. Today was maybe three or four bogeys. In the first two rounds I only made two. Just little things like that that can compound. But just doing the little things right definitely helped under pressure.

Q. Is there anything you have to watch out for with yourself when you get early in a final round and you're still a little pumped up?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Not really. Sometimes it's the other way around; I feel like I've got to get going. I just need to make sure I can commit to my shot. If I can do that, I feel like that's the best way to give myself a chance. You don't really want to be guidey when you're playing under pressure. Just trying to stay in the present and commit on every shot.

Q. Do you think it'll play slightly easier with you guys going off a couple hours earlier compared to today when the greens were probably a little more baked out?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I mean, I'm still going to be one of the last guys out. I don't know if I'll be in the last group, but it might be a little softer. I think it's more about the wind maybe blowing a little less, which can make it a little easier on some holes. But if you're on the fairway, you can get spin on it. If you're in the rough, then it's a guessing game.
