CAM DAVIS (-4)



Q. Cam, battled back from a triple at 11 with three birdies in your last seven. What allowed you to kind of recenter after that to finish strong?

CAM DAVIS: Honestly, I was trying my best to put a really good round together and not make any big mistakes, and after I made that big mistake on 11, I kind of just, I don't know, the mindset changed from trying to have a really good score without making any mistakes to not really caring that much if I put a poor swing on it or not anymore. I just kind of, I don't know, I just, I just freed up and just started playing golf because I kind of thought that my chances of getting through to next week were kind of out of my hands at that point.

Q. How do you describe your last two holes, a birdie on 17 and then a nice par, up-and-down par on 18?

CAM DAVIS: Yeah, hit some good shots. I don't know. Yeah, I didn't feel super special, I didn't really know what I was playing for at the end there other than a bit of pride and for as good a finish as I can finish in this tournament, too. It was nice to make the putt on 18 there.

Q. There's a lot that could happen that could be the difference, might not be.

CAM DAVIS: Yeah.

Q. Do you have a gut instinct now of whether --

CAM DAVIS: No idea. I'm not going to ride that emotional rollercoaster. I've been on the cutline every year I feel like since I've been on Tour, whether it's for the 50 or for this. No, it's too stressful to keep your eyes on it or try to follow too closely what's going on.

I'm going to get a text message at the end of the day that tells me where I sit, and I'm flying to Nashville tonight and I'm either driving to Memphis from there or I'm flying home. Either way, we'll find out.

Q. Why Nashville, any particular reason?

CAM DAVIS: My caddie, Andrew, lives up there and he's going up there anyway. He's going to drive down so at least I had like a halfway point either way. Got half of my travel plans already booked, it's just where we go from there. I would love to play next week. I know it's going to be warm, but it's another opportunity to have a week that turns things around. Yeah, it's out of my hands now.



Q. Lastly, how do you feel right now?

CAM DAVIS: I feel tired. I've pushed really hard for the last few months and it's not led to any better golf. I've had a couple of little bright moments, but you can probably count on one hand since April.

So I'm almost pretty much ready to put the clubs away for a little bit and just rest my brain and work on that as well because I would say that more than anything else has been the thing that I've found the hardest to get on top of.

Yeah, either way, whether I get to play next week or not, I'm looking forward to the time after that where I can put the feet up.
