ROBBY SHELTON (-15)

Q. Robby, that was a very exciting way to end there. You want to just walk me through that last hole?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah. I was hot with the putter all day. I was just, if I got on the green I felt good about it. On the last hole I had a 35-footer for birdie.

Q. Now you take the clubhouse co-lead right now. How does it feel to be kind of back-to-back weeks doing that?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah, it feels good to be in contention again. Working hard all year on the same stuff, finally it's coming together.

Q. Is there anything that made you specifically find your rhythm these last few weeks?

ROBBY SHELTON: Not really. It's been the same thing with the swing and then the putter just finally got hot.

Q. Back into contention again, like you said. Anything to take from last week?

ROBBY SHELTON: Just a little more hunger, I'd say. Was co-leader going into the final day last week and just didn't play well on Sunday, didn't have it. Hopefully if I work on it, I should be able to play well again tomorrow.

Q. And every one is special, of course, but five times is going to be coming up. Just how would that feel to really grasp that?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah, it would feel good. I feel like if you win it kind of solves everything. Hopefully I get it done.

Q. How did your morning start, early morning? Did you hear the sirens?

ROBBY SHELTON: I did, yeah. It was kind of scary, honestly, I didn't know what to expect. Definitely woke us up for a couple hours.

Q. Did you go back to bed or stay up?

ROBBY SHELTON: I went back to bed for probably an hour and a half I'd say. I had a late tee time.

Q. How did the course hold up? Obviously soft.

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah, it was pretty soft. It was gettable if you were in the fairways. That's the key out here, the rough's pretty thick. Just stay in the fairway and usually have a lot of birdie putts in.

Q. You won three years ago here, a lot of good feelings?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah.

Q. You don't want to ever come back to a Korn Ferry Tour event, but a lot of good feelings from '22 to come back here?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah, I think this course fits me. I did hit a lot of fairways and if the putter's working it's usually a good week.

Q. A lot of people remember you?

ROBBY SHELTON: A few people, yeah. I've had some guys come up to me.

Q. Kelsey has been here since Thursday, I believe, watching you, following you. What's it been like having her out here this week?

ROBBY SHELTON: Yeah, it's been nice. She gets to come to quite a few, but it's nice to have her out here each and every week.

Q. I heard she brought Riggs.

ROBBY SHELTON: She did.

Q. And you have a new puppy, too?

ROBBY SHELTON: We do.

Q. Riggs is the one that's here right now though. What's it like to go back to him? Is he going to come out tomorrow?
