ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART (-20)

Q. Adrien, 61-61, that's the lowest 36-hole score in Korn Ferry Tour history. I guess just take us through what's been working the first two days with your game.

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I've hit the ball really well. The putter got hot as well. Just being able to get momentum out here is big.

If you start on 10, you get four par 5s in the first 10 holes so those are definitely good birdie opportunities. If you can play those well and make a couple other birdies on some other holes, you can (indiscernible,) right, you're making two long putts or one chip-in and you end up shooting 9, 10.

But yeah, I feel like overall my game's in a pretty good spot.

Q. What's kind of the key for you getting low scores out here? We've seen a lot of low numbers out here, but what is it about this course that can set you up to do that?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I mean, the fairways are pretty wide. Sometimes when fairways are that wide, it's kind of hard to pick a small target. I still think hitting it on the fairways is a big advantage out here, and then missing on the correct side of the hole, giving yourself some easier birdie putts. There's a bunch of slope on those greens so if you can use it to your advantage, you can actually make your landing dispersion quite wide. So just kind of using the course to your advantage is definitely big out here.

Q. Going into the weekend, obviously see what happens this afternoon knowing that anyone can really put up a low number and guys are chasing, what's the thought process there knowing anyone can jump up the board?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I mean, people are going to shoot low scores tomorrow, Sunday. The Korn Ferry's that way. Even though I'm at 20 under, just a lot of work to do this weekend. Davis hasn't played yet; he could be at 22 at the end of the day.

I think yeah, you've just got to put the pedal down and keep going, try to not look back.

Q. A little bit different for you this year than it was in '23. You had your card locked up, now you're kind of trying to chase it down. What's kind of the difference in mindset for you doing that, trying to get your PGA TOUR card?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, it's definitely a big goal of mine to get it back. Can't really think too much about it, right? Just trusting the process and try to do your best on every shot. I think that's kind of what I told myself yesterday when I started my round and I'm already 12 back. I'm like, I know the course is playing easy but still, right? If you kind of get ahead of yourself it gets a little tough, but if you can just stick to your process and your routine and just focus on your target, that's really all you can do. If it works out, it works out. If it doesn't, it doesn't. Just means I've got to get better, right?

Q. Two events left, what's been your overall thoughts on your game this year and just how you've played compared to maybe your expectations?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I mean overall I've had some good tournaments. There's a few things I've had to work on. I made some changes at the end of 2023 which felt a little tough last year, but this year it's starting to feel better, which is great. I've actually noticed some really good play. There is a few things that I need to get better at if I want to shoot consistently some good scores.

Q. What was kind of the main change you were working on?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I had a little wrist injury so I had to change my grip at the end of 2023. My actual dispersion was a little different than what I used to do in 2023. So last year the ball really wasn't going where I wanted it to go and my misses were not the same as what I'd been used to. I'm glad I'm back to hitting those shots that I like and that's usually when I play my best.

Q. You mentioned being 12 behind before you even teed off yesterday. How does that affect you? Do you press on it, just play your normal game?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, it was definitely like I knew the scores were going to be low, right? Sometimes you feel like OK, you're 12 back, you want to force it in. I said OK, just trust the process. I was only 2 under heading to 18, starting on 10 so I wasn't playing like that well really. I know the front nine's a little harder than the back nine. Just stick to it.

Got really hot on my last eight holes yesterday and was able to make those four-, five-footers for birdie and keep momentum going and now we're at 10.

Q. Well, conversely, can you imagine being Davis and shooting a 59 before you tee off, you're eight shots behind?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, that's right. Davis is a really good friend of mine, he's a really good player so I'm sure he's going to have a good round out there. But scores are low, so there's two more rounds, (indiscernible) to shoot a low one.
