CHANDLER BLANCHET (-16)

Q. Well, Chandler, you officially got the news that you're going to the PGA TOUR next season. Just what does it feel like to finally hear those words?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Crazy. Man, I got goosebumps thinking about it. I've worked on this for my entire life. Yeah, it's awesome to hear.

Q. Thinking back to the start of this year, I was on a flight with you when you were a conditional member just trying to get in the field. Looking back on the season and starting conditional and grinding to get your Tour card, what has the season been like for you?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: It's been amazing. I mean, it's kind of wild, I had like a weird like peace about me to start the season. I knew I was going to get into a few international events and had success down there.

I remember talking to my wife, like I wasn't too worried about it. I knew -- I don't know, I had a good feeling to start the season. I had been playing well, body was feeling good and obviously kind of just parlayed it. Had a really good start down there and brought that to the States and kept playing good.

It's been a very consistent year, it's been a lot of fun. I keep learning about my game and like little things that keep bringing to the next week.

Q. You've been grinding for a while now and this year you broke through with a win. Just what was that like earlier this year to break through and then realize I have a chance to get my PGA TOUR card this year?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Yeah, I put myself in a good position with a lot of good finishes, a couple top-10s and top-25 prior to the win so I knew the win was going to put me close to where we needed to be. It was a dream week. I started out 10 under, 10 under, kind of like Adrien this week, just kept it going. That was a great week to kind of gain that confidence, play all four rounds and end up lifting the trophy at the end of the week.

Honestly, after that it was almost a new kind of pressure, like wow, started really well, we still have eight events, we still have to keep it going to keep these points. I don't know what the threshold was going to be, some guys look at that more than others. I try to kind of avoid looking at it too much but I played consistent since then, so it's been a great finish to the

year.

Q. With your golf journey, playing Latin America, Korn Ferry Tour, at times back and forth, was there a point where you thought maybe I'm not sure about something else besides golf or were you committed the whole time, never really wavered from it?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Never really wavered, no. I knew I had it in me, just needed for the right moment. Keep sticking along with it and break through at some point.

Like I said, my wife has been absolutely incredible. Got two little kids at home and she holds down the house. She's got a great job and supported me on the years I wasn't doing well, so she took that stress off my back and said just go play, get back out there and see what we can do.

Q. You mentioned you had a daughter earlier this month. What's it like, your life been like this year, maybe your biggest year of golf up to this point and having your second child, what's it all been like for you looking back at it now?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: I seem to play well every time I'm having a kid, might need to keep 'em coming.

It's been a great year. My son is like incredible, so much fun to bring him out to the golf course. He's got a little driver. Just been a lot of fun. Like going home, I love being home, I love being on the road. But being back home is special. So I'm excited for these next few months, get to maybe get a little closer to my daughter and keep growing with my son.
