ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART (-33)

Q. Adrien, obviously the win but you're going back to the PGA TOUR now. Just how's it feel to hear that?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Pretty special. I mean, this year was a grind. I did feel pretty good about my game but I just struggled on the third and four rounds. To come out this week and having the lead after two rounds and keeping it and actually increasing it is something I'm very proud of.

Q. How's it feel to get your card this way? You were kind of outside that top-20 for a good portion of the year and you kind of come up and almost steal one today with the win.

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I mean, it's awesome. You know, being just, I was 26th and 20 make it. It's hard because sometimes you want to force it, you want to give all your chances to make it, but sometimes you just have to be patient and trust in the process, and I feel like this week I did a really good job of that. Especially after the first round when, like I said, a couple days ago I started and I was 12 back, right? That's something that you need to learn and just kind of focus on yourself. I was 12 back when I started my round and I won by 7, so this is pretty cool.

Q. Yeah, you took over the second round, really didn't look back. What was your mindset, keep moving forward and not really looking back at guys catching you or letting someone come up and catch you?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, the second and third round, trying to make as many birdies as I can. Today was definitely a little different because there's some holes where you can be aggressive or conservative, so I decided to be a little more conservative because you don't want to be routine three times and giving away all your lead. So I'm glad that I was able to stay aggressive while being more conservative.

Q. Looking back at this season, what do you feel you've learned or something you can take back the second time around now on the PGA TOUR next season?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I mean, it all comes down to really practicing the right way. If I can challenge myself day in and day out, that's going to translate on the course. I feel like the last few weeks I've been practicing better even though the scores might not have showed up in Columbus and Nashville, but this week it did. So just being

competitive like I learned in school in Illinois and doing the little things right.

Q. We talked about the injury you were dealing with previously in the past and kind of battling your way back to where you want your game to be. Does it feel like you kind of cemented that with the win today, and was there any times that it was kind of a struggle with that injury?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I mean, injury wise it was fine. I did win on the Korn Ferry with two different grips so that's something I'm really proud of. I mean, I used a reversible grip, very week left hand, bowing on top and now I have more of a standard grip. That took a lot of time to get adjusted. Like anything, if you keep at it and stay positive, good things are going to happen.

Q. Today and maybe a little bit yesterday the wind picked up around this course. Just how did it change compared to the first two days?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Definitely harder. The greens get a little firmer. What's hard out here, the weather was so nice that there's no clouds so it's kind of hard sometime to trust wind because there's no blowing in the trees but sometimes you've got to really commit to it and play the wind and be on the correct side. If you're on the correct side out here, you can use the slopes and make a lot of birdies.

Q. I've never thought I would hear a guy who shot 33 under use the word "conservative" in a final round. That's pretty impressive.

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, like I said, there's a couple holes where you can be aggressive but if you're in the trees or in the water, you have to re-tee. So there's definitely a couple holes where I tried to make par or give myself a good chance for birdie and some others where you have to be aggressive and take advantage.

Q. So with the burden of whether I'm going to make it to the top-20 or not off your back now, what are the goals? I know you're right in the immediacy after winning this, but what are the goals now?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: I mean, it's going to be nice to be able to enjoy my offseason, get back in the gym, work hard and just get ready for 2026 on the PGA TOUR. Now that I know most courses on the PGA TOUR, it will be a little easier to prepare. Really looking forward to it.

Q. I heard from your girlfriend's father that you're talking about getting in the gym and that he would suggest you might need to work on your jump shot.

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: It's really not that bad, but yeah, growing up in Belgium, basketball is not very popular. It does look a little funky, but I'm pretty competitive so I feel like I can get the job done. It definitely doesn't look pretty.

Q. So you would give it back to him, wouldn't you?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, I would, I would.

Q. You grew up playing tennis?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah.

Q. Some of us may know the story, but did you just migrate to golf?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: So I played a lot of tennis and golf growing up. We don't have sports in school, so you have to do it outside school. I mean, I was actually better at tennis at a younger age, but I fell in love with golf. I can practice on my own, I could hit so many different type of shot where tennis I feel like I was -- I wouldn't say getting a little bored, but the mindset wasn't there when I was 12 or 13. Every tournament there's parents on the side and they're calling the shot. I'm 12 and I don't have my parents there, so it was a little different. But golf, yeah, I just fell in love more than I did with tennis.

Q. Real quick, after you birdied 10, did you kind of just put it in neutral for a few holes there and just go for the flat part of the greens?

ADRIEN DUMONT DE CHASSART: Yeah, even though it looked like I had a six, seven shot lead for a while, Marcelo was playing pretty well, he looked really confident out there. He definitely put a little pressure on me, I'd say. Making that birdie on 10 was big time, I just kind of got a shot back on him. And play 11, 12, 13, 14, I knew if I parred those holes, it's really not that bad, maybe I'll throw one or two birdies. And I knew that heading into 15, 16, those would be birdie chances. And I kind of told myself if I can shoot 5, 6 under today, I'll actually get the job done. I don't think someone's going to shoot 57 or 58 to get it done but you never know. Someone can always shoot a 61 last round and actually put some pressure on you. So I'm glad I was able to stay in the moment and make some birdies at the start.
