CHANDLER BLANCHET (-14)

Q. Chandler, kind of a double win today. What does this whole thing mean to you?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: I don't know if I have a word for it right now. I mean, incredible day. It was super intense. I played really, really well today. I knew there was a Tour card coming at the end of today, but this is just the cherry on top. It was an incredible week, and incredible to experience this with the other 20 players, or 19 players and my family here.

Q. You alluded to that. What did it mean to have your family here? I know your first win this year, you FaceTimed in.

CHANDLER BLANCHET: It's the dream of all of us, I think. Anybody you ask, you want to have your family there, you want to have that experience when you walk up the green and they're greeting you. Absolutely incredible to have my wife and my kids, my mom, my brother. A lot of loved ones here, so really awesome.

Q. Just how's it feel to be going to the PGA TOUR?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Yeah, awesome. I feel like I've worked on this for 20-plus years, been grinding as a professional for eight years and it's kind of all coming together this year to a really exciting, really good year. I'm excited to put my game to the test next year.

Q. What would you say was your kind of competitive advantage this week in particular?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Definitely a little freed up, right? I knew at the end of the week I had a Tour card. There's some pretty tight tee shots and some pretty small greens out here, and I was still competing to win but I didn't necessarily maybe feel that pressure that a missed green isn't going to lead to a Tour card so I was a little more freed up.

Q. It's fair to say you knew this week was going to be a win either way?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Definitely, yeah. Definitely a win, big win.

Q. And I guess your brother in particular, we talked to him this week. I know he played college golf and you kind of followed in his footsteps. I guess what has the relationship with him meant to you in your golf development?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Yeah, he's my best friend. He's why I started playing golf. He's eight years older than me. Naturally being the little brother, I was 7, he was 15, he was playing golf and I naturally picked it up. So I was trying to beat him for the next 15 years. He hung it up and then I started beating him. It's incredible to have him here. He was actually here with me at the Latin Tour Championship when I won that one, too. I just bring him in for the tour championships, I guess. It's really cool to have him here, he's kind of what started it all.

Q. We were talking to your wife and she mentioned when you guys reconnected and started dating like eight, nine years ago, you talked about how your vision was to be on the PGA TOUR and become one of the best players in the world. With your family here, what's it kind of mean to deliver on that vision you laid out eight, nine years ago?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Yeah, it's incredible. My wife is an absolute trouper. She's a super wife, super mom. She's been there through the highs and lows and like supported me to an incredible extent. She trusted me, she knew what could be at the end, what it could mean and what it could lead to. She supported me and never questioned me, so I appreciate her beyond words.

Q. Talk about this weekend here in French Lick, just participating here in the tournament and how good of a job did they do staging the tournament?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: Yeah, the course is incredible. It's one of the tougher courses we play all year. It's a great playoff course, great course to end the season on. This is what we want to see, right, where it's tough, there's some separation of the pack. You've got to drive it well, you've got to putt it well, you've got to hit your irons really well, small greens. And the course is in immaculate condition, super consistent, you knew what you were getting. It was a great test.

Q. What's it mean that your son kind of went right back to the grind after --

CHANDLER BLANCHET: I walked off the 18th green, he said, "Daddy, I want to go hit balls." He loves it. It's been fun. He's got a driver and a 7-iron. When he tees it up, he's got a good swing on him. You can't teach that stuff. Hopefully he keeps it up, but we have a lot of fun with it.

Q. You just had your second kid, what, a month ago? I mean, you think that the relationship is going to be like you and your brother's?

CHANDLER BLANCHET: I hope so. Me and my brother are super close. Maybe we weren't as close when we were younger just because of the age gap, but him and his sister will be just about two years apart. He's so sweet with her right now, like loves petting her head and holding her. He's been awesome. They're going to be best friends soon.
