MIKE WEIR (-7)



Q. Mike, nice 4 under today. Get some comments on your play today, maybe that last birdie to close out your round.

MIKE WEIR: Yeah, I played -- got off to a bit of a slow start and then I played well after that. Hit a number of shots close to the hole for most of my birdies. A couple of two-putts on 9 and 18, a couple looks at eagles that it's nice to get birdies on those holes. Course played a little bit tricky today. Wind was a different direction today out of the south compared to the north, so the course played a little different, but happy with my score.

Q. Coming into the week you need a pretty good week to get into next week's event. Just what was your mindset coming in? Is it something you've been paying attention to?

MIKE WEIR: To be honest, not really. My mindset this week was to just play the kind of golf I can play and then end this year on a good note going into next year and start playing the golf that I know I can play. So far, so good. I want to finish it off, no matter what happens tomorrow, I just want to finish it off the way I'm playing and lead that into next year.

Q. And then going into tomorrow after two good rounds, maybe a back door chance to have an opportunity to win this event?

MIKE WEIR: Yeah, it depends on how the guys finish. They have a couple par 5s as well. A strong player is probably going to get a few more. But I'm making lots of birdies, I've just got to cut down my mistakes. I've made plenty of birdies, I've made probably five or six bogeys, so I'm sitting at 7 under with five or six bogeys. So if I can cut those out a little bit more tomorrow, I'll have a good chance.

Q. Mike, what's been the difference in the last month or two maybe with your game because it has progressed in the right direction?

MIKE WEIR: Yeah, it's starting to get a little bit better. I don't know, I don't know if it's Presidents Cup hangover where I just -- I don't know, or just the way the game is sometimes where you just kind of get in a bit of a funk. I was definitely in that and not playing well. Just couldn't put anything together, not drive it good, not putt good, just couldn't put the whole game together. Starting to put it together a little bit better.

Q. Can you speak on how frustrating that is when you can't --

MIKE WEIR: You know, any of us out here that's played a long time, when you get in a funk

like that, it's tough. It's tough to play, especially as you get a little bit older. You know, you second guess whether you want to keep doing it. So I'm probably going to start playing a little bit less as the years go on here, but I do want to play and play well when I do play. So the fire's still there to work on the game and kind of improve it. You go through ebbs and flows in your career, in your game and years, and this year hasn't been so good. But hopefully I can end it well and do some good things next year.
