Q. And this is obviously such a high level tournament and this is such a well-known, historic golf course, so what's it like for you being able to play here in this tournament?

MEGAN MENG: I think it's so awesome. It's so cool that I can say I played the same course that the FedExCup Championship is at. Like even if I wasn't like a big golf course guru, I feel like that's something so cool and like anybody could like honestly think about or know about or like relate to. So it's really cool, I'm really happy to be here.

Q. And what did you learn from your match today that you are going to be able to take with you into match play tomorrow?

MEGAN MENG: Kind of doing more of the same knowing that I have the game and that I just need to keep doing what I've been doing.
