ADAM RENFROE: Good morning, everyone. Welcome to Hammock Beach Resort & Spa.

My name is Adam Renfroe and I have the great pleasure of serving as the tournament director of Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS. I'm going to spend some time this morning facilitating a conversation with these folks up here who are all instrumental in bringing our event to Hammock Beach.

Our hope is that through our conversation we'll convey our enthusiasm for being here at Hammock Beach. We'll talk about our excitement of expanding the footprint of the Jim and Tabitha Furyk Foundation and we'll give you a preview of the fan experience as we build out our debut event here in 2026.

Before I introduce our speakers today, I do want to recognize and thank our Jacksonville area media partners who are here today. Many of you covered our event for the last five years and you're continuing that commitment as we move to Palm Coast. I thank you for being here.

And if you're a media outlet covering our event for the first time today, welcome. Thank you for being here and we certainly hope this is the start of a great partnership as we shed light on the great work that Jim and Tabitha are doing through their foundation.

So let me introduce our speakers here and then we'll get into some questions. Seated to my right is the president of PGA TOUR Champions, Miller Brady. To his right, the general manager here at Hammock Beach Golf Resort & Spa, Mr. Brad Hauer. To the right of the trophy, executive vice president and chief commercial officer of Constellation, Jim McHugh. And to his right, 17-time PGA TOUR winner and tournament co-host, Jim Furyk. Seated to his right is president of the Jim and Tabitha Furyk Foundation and also tournament co-host, Tabitha Furyk.

So Jim McHugh, I'll start with you. Constellations been the driving force behind our tournament for the last five years. What is it about the partnership with PGA TOUR Champions and the Furyks that makes so much sense for Constellation's business?

JIM McHUGH: Thanks, Adam. Appreciate that.

At Constellation, we look at our partnership investments really as like key elements to our overall marketing strategy and they allow for a few things. They allow us to showcase our



brand, they allow us to provide customer hosting experiences where we can interact in a key way with our customers.

The Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS is definitely the marquee partnership in our portfolio and the title sponsorship really gives us the opportunity for a very unique experiences with all the folks that come down to be part of the event with us.

Just this past 2025 tournament we had well over 100 or 150 of our key customers that were able to be here and really spend time with our day-to-day contacts and the senior leaders of Constellation in a relaxed environment and that just makes for a good place to talk to and establish these relationships with our customers. We're looking forward to bringing that to Hammock Beach to have a whole new customer hospitality experience for them.

And then really on the opposite side, the business side is just our long-standing partnership with Jim and Tabitha. It's grounded in just shared values that we have between Constellation and the Furyks and they're all foundational for this event. We're so thrilled that the tournament showcases community engagement and gives back to organizations that are doing wonderful work in the community and we want to extend that impact to here in the Palm Coast area. The event and the sponsorship and the partnership, they're just so special to us at Constellation and we look forward to extending that to the Hammock Beach hosting facility and really have new fans and new volunteers and the community to engage with next year.

ADAM RENFROE: That's great. Thanks, Jim. And you mentioned the partnership that you've had with Jim and Tabitha for a long time, so Tabitha, I'll kick it to you.

What has Constellation's support meant to the foundation's mission over the years?

TABITHA FURYK: I'll have to say we're pretty fortunate to have such a great partner in Constellation. They've been amazing. And it's been over 20 years, but for the first five years of the tournament we hosted we were able to raise over \$5 million because of their support, which is incredible for charitable organizations.

Charity is at the heart of what they do, it's what we do, and I think what makes us such great partners is that we really want to impact and be positive about the communities and the work that we're doing in them. So having a partnership with them, providing crazy amazing new standards in how we're producing energy and being able to provide it to make our world a little better place, and us to be able to partner and do all of the charitable work we're doing to make all of the communities that we're in a better place, it's really just a great partnership and we're blessed to start our next chapter here at Hammock Beach.

ADAM RENFROE: And Brad, this is definitely the most ideal setting for a press conference of all time. Hammock Beach is such a stunning property.



What is it about the resort and the course here that makes it the perfect fit for Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS?

BRAD HAUER: Yeah, thanks, Adam. Can't say how super excited we are about this event, as you know.

We'll start with the Ocean Course. With six holes right on the ocean, a mile of oceanfront golf, a Jack Nicklaus signature designed golf course, this is lined up to just be a phenomenal tournament for the players. And we know firsthand how excited the players will be because we hosted the Champions Tour back in '07 and '08, and then in 2008, after the first year, we had the best field on the Champions Tour in like several years as Miller may mention as well.

So the players are going to love it here and they're going to love the resort because it's a destination that it's a one stop shop. Once you're here, you don't have to leave the property. We have beautiful accommodations, we have the restaurants, the pools, the beach access, spa and the fitness. I could go on and on. Our Conservatory golf course, the Tom Watson signature design for anyone that wants to buzz away for a quick round is there and available.

But what's really super important about this property and we discussed it a lot on the tours taking Jim and Tabitha around are the outdoor venues that we have here. For the concerts, all the food and beverage functions that are going to take place, it's just absolutely spectacular. We just had our Men's Invitational, we had our opening reception out on the driving range and it's just magical, it's really magical. We're just the perfect place for this type of event.

And then finally, what really brings us to life is our team members, the people that work here. We have over 100 that have been here 10-plus years that just know the mission of service and how important this event's going to be for us under the leadership of our managing director, Carlton Grant, who's in the back there. We're really as a team really super excited to help bring this to life for year No. 6.

ADAM RENFROE: That's fantastic. Brad, you've always mentioned how enthusiastic the membership is to host the event, but you've also been so thoughtful in considering the community aspect of this. So how important and how meaningful is it to host a PGA TOUR Champions event in Flagler County?

BRAD HAUER: Yeah, several thoughts there. Just first of all, the economic impact that this will make on our community for the local businesses, hotels, restaurants. It's a lot of fans, sponsors, players, you name it are going to be here for not only that week but for the weeks to come up to this. So the financial impact is extremely important.



But what's really, really important, and Tabitha mentioned this, is the charity side of this. Our community, Hammock Beach community, is a charitable community. When they get behind a charity, they really support it full on.

When you go to the FURYK & FRIENDS website you'll see firsthand in big bold letters "building community on the course for charity." That is the mission for this event and that's one thing I learned after many meetings with the team Furyk here that that's the mission.

I know, I'm 100 percent confident that our membership, club membership will be right behind that.

And then finally, I think this event for us really validates Hammock Beach, validates who we are, what we are in the community that we have. Again, we couldn't be more excited about -- I wish this thing was starting tomorrow actually, but we couldn't be more excited.

ADAM RENFROE: And Brad, we'll have to echo your comments about your team. I think that's what elevates this resort beyond anything else, any other place we could be, just the care with which you guys, you're so thoughtful about everything you do and you've got an amazing team, you should be very proud.

Jim, I guess we should probably get you involved at some point. We visited the resort as a team last year and really was our first time to see the property, we didn't know a lot about it. I recall us being blown away by what the resort had to offer. We had a lot of great conversation on the back end.

What stood out to you the most and what do you think is going to be the favorite amongst the players?

JIM FURYK: Yeah, I think a number of things. I had never been to the resort until we visited last year. I had heard so much about it living in Jacksonville. From our home it's barely over an hour, it's not that far.

I came walking through the back doors top of the steps right next to the steakhouse, looked down and went, oh, my goodness, look how beautiful this is. Staring at the beach, the event lawn, the golf course. Of course I drifted over to 18 by myself to kind of take a look at the condition of the golf course. The Paspalum fairways, spectacular. It looked like a carpet, it looked like you could have held a Tour event on it that day. So couldn't wait to get in a cart with Brad, drive around the course, see the layout.

You can tell that obviously this breeze -- I got lucky, we played yesterday, there was zero wind. I've never been here when that happened before, it was kind of nice for my game. Getting out here in the breeze, that's the defense of this golf course. Jack built a golf course that's somewhat wide and generous on the fairways. It needs to be in this wind, but it's got some teeth on the greens, some undulation.



As Brad mentioned earlier, I think single digits won this event. That never happens on the Champions Tour. I feel like you have to shoot 15 under every week. So you catch a little breeze, a little wind out here, this place is going to provide a test for the players.

I'm just impressed by when I think about our event, what we created and even in the name, the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS, for us it's kind of not only our friends but our family and that shows up in a lot of different ways.

We have friends from our community that support the event and charities. We have friends that come in from all over the country to participate in the pro-ams, to watch the tournament themselves.

And then you have the family aspect. For us being with Constellation now for over I think 25 years, it feels like family.

So when I come to Hammock Beach, I immediately notice the number of families, the kids running around the pool. I've met so many members over the last so many visits. Just talking to a guy last night; yeah, we live in Orange Park up in Jacksonville. Well, we did, we used to vacation down here. We used to come down on the weekends, now we live here full time.

This is really a community that's built around family and folks that want to come visit, want to spend time with their kids. So that's what our guests, Constellation, our players, all of our friends that travel in are just going to see a wonderful community, a wonderful resort.

It just, when we walked through those doors and learned more about what you're doing here, Brad and his team feel like family, we knew we were in the right spot and we're excited for our opportunity and our next step.

ADAM RENFROE: That's fantastic.

Miller, I don't know if you get enough credit in this whole scenario, but you were involved back in 2007, 2008 for the Ginn Championship and every time you spoke to us it seemed like you brought up Hammock Beach as a spot that we should check out.

So what is it about this place that makes you think that it will be a player favorite?

MILLER BRADY: Well, I don't really need the credit or want the credit, I'm just glad that we're here.

Brad was here back in 2007, 2008 and you can see the enthusiasm here between Constellation, the foundation, Hammock Beach, obviously the Tour, you guys.

It's a special place. And Brad mentioned the strongest field that we had back in 2008. I believe it was won by Bernhard Langer. He seems to win everything. He'll be back in 2026 to try and win again.



But the players love being here. You mentioned earlier, you stay here, you eat here, you entertain here, you roll out to the practice facility. So the players are going to love the experience.

But what impressed me most back in 2007 and 2008 was the community itself. What I mean by that is you had a lot of volunteers that helped support the event, but we also had really good crowds, right, and what are we, 17, 18 years later, I think it's just going to be that much more impactful when we're here next year.

So yeah, I wish we were playing next week as well. Really excited on behalf of the Champions Tour.

ADAM RENFROE: Awesome. And Miller, you've worked with a number of different tournament hosts. What sets Jim and Tabitha apart as they interact --

MILLER BRADY: Tabitha.

ADAM RENFROE: -- with players and -- agreed, agreed.

MILLER BRADY: You know, they mentioned family, right? Everyone that works on behalf of the tournament or works on the foundation side, they're like family to the Furyks. I think that is really what's special is that Tabitha, you guys, your entire team, you're so vested in the success, every detail.

And it happens all year long. No matter what they're doing, their attention to detail is amazing. I think that's why the players feel so welcome when they come to the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS.

ADAM RENFROE: And I will say firsthand that the drive for us to be detail oriented and put on a good tournament comes from Tabitha. She sets a standard for us to follow each and every day.

So Tab, charity's always guided every decision we've made. Every decision with the tournament is made with the thought of charity in mind. Can you share some stories or milestones that we've accomplished in our first five years that you're most proud of?

TABITHA FURYK: Absolutely. Yeah, as Adam mentioned in 2010 when we started our foundation, we wanted to do something to give back to our community. We wanted to make a difference. Jim has been blessed with a fantastic career. At the time he won the FedExCup, and what's our next move?

Our next move was, what can we do to give back? That has grown in the last 15 years, and it's hard to believe it's been 15 years We've really made some huge strides. Even just with



Constellation alone, some of the things that are important to them are some of the things that are important to us.

I've been talking to some of the members and I'm finding out that it's also important to them. We through Blessing in a Backpack provided in the five years over 200,000 hunger-free weekends for children.

That's part of what we want to do when we come here, we want to help embrace the community and figure out ways that we can help.

Also with Constellation, the Saint Johns Riverkeeper, the field trips, the education we were able to provide our Title 1 schools who never had an opportunity to be on a boat or to be on the Saint Johns River. Those are experiences that they will take with them for a lifetime.

Habitat for Humanity, we built a number of homes. We took the Constellation crew out, handed them paint brushes, all sorts of tools. We said get to work, right?

So we're building in our community, we're truly making a difference. So knowing that we're able to expand on that and come to a new home here and to expand what we're doing for northeast Florida I think is tremendous, and I'm so excited to hear that the membership is very driven when it comes to charity because as Adam said, I'm not cracking a whip but I do get very excited about what we can do to make a difference and we're excited to have such a good group supporting us.

ADAM RENFROE: And we accomplish a lot of our charitable giving through creating a great tournament experience, try to do everything we can for fans and players and families that come and enjoy the tournament.

So Tabitha, as we look at opportunities here in 2026, what do you expect from the fan experience?

TABITHA FURYK: Well, as we talked about before, this venue is unbelievable, so I'm excited to share it with folks who have never been here before, like let them experience that, but at the same time we want to continue to build on what we've done over the years, right?

We've provided this great environment that's a lot of fun. There is some golf going on in the background but we always make sure that we're great food, great fun and great music, and we don't want that to change, right? We want to bring that here. We want to bring that family environment where you come, have a great time together whether you're entertaining clients or you're walking around with your kids. Whatever it may be, we want it to be fun.

So I know we've had a Tailgate Village in the past, we always have football on the big screen TVs. So you might watch some great action on 18, you might turn around and catch your favorite football team. It's going to be a very fun environment and we look forward to having everybody come out and enjoy that.



ADAM RENFROE: I think you guys have done a really good job of answering this question, but Jim, you've always said that golf is the vehicle that allows us to do so much more at the tournament. How do you see that coming alive here?

JIM FURYK: Absolutely. As Tabitha said, we're going to have this little golf tournament, 78 of the best players in the world over the age of 50, Hall of Famers. It brings folks out, but really it's about our foundation, Tabitha's vision. It's about banding our communities together to bring folks out to create revenue for the wonderful organizations that help those folks.

Yeah, football games on TV, Club 58, the views, you've got the beach out in the background, we've got a lot of different -- we try to create an atmosphere that no matter what age, no matter what you like to do, there's going to be some fun.

And yes, there's going to be a great golf tournament out there but our professionals love playing in an atmosphere where it feels big, where there's a lot of fans packed in, they're having a good time, they're partying, they're cheering. We have zones set up on the seventh hole, birdie beers, two-dollar beers after a birdie on a par 3, we'll bring that to Hammock Beach.

17's always been for us a live event, basically a little mini we'll call it Phoenix surrounding a hole where everyone can enjoy it, we'll bring that to Hammock Beach.

Really, it's a big party. Tabitha and I like to have a good time, we like to entertain, we like to enjoy. Constellation does as well, thank goodness.

JIM McHUGH: Shared values.

JIM FURYK: Shared values. But in the process, golf is the vehicle that's brought so much to our community. It's brought so much to our lives and giving back is part of the PGA TOUR Champions. So helping the communities and now moving down here into Flagler County and being able to spread our wings and grow as a foundation is really important. We just look forward to the challenge and we look forward to some great success.

ADAM RENFROE: Well, I know I can speak for everyone here that we're really excited to be here at Hammock Beach. So many exciting moments ahead of us now, we're just getting started.

If I don't mention this, I'll miss, but Constellation is the reason that we are here and their support has allowed us to do so many things, not just putting on a great golf tournament but doing so much for charities. Without the Constellation team we wouldn't be sitting here today, so thank you.

JIM McHUGH: Thanks, Adam.



ADAM RENFROE: We'll open it up now to questions.

Q. I've got a question for the Furyks. First one, meant to be humorous, second one not so much. First one, as you were touring the course, Jim, could you see a sub 60?

JIM FURYK: No. I haven't seen one of those in a long time.

Q. Great. And for Tabitha and for you both, obviously you're leaving a legacy as a couple. How do you see this leaving a legacy not just for the communities that you've touched but as a, importantly as parents, what's the legacy that you're leaving for your children?

JIM FURYK: I think a lot of a number of the events that we host, you know, we pack holiday meals, Hope for the Holidays every December. That event was really about bringing families bringing their children, kind of a wake-up call for some that there's so many people in our community that are in need, that are food insecure, they don't know where that next meal is coming from.

I think that's probably my favorite event because each and every year the kids come back. They've grown up. Ours want to come back from school or come back from work, out of town to witness that event.

So yeah, being able to kind of teach your families, teach your children about giving back, about the future and about those in need in your community is really important and it's been a big part of Tabitha's vision and the mission statement for our foundation.

TABITHA FURYK: Absolutely. The Tour does a great job, when Jim was a rookie on Tour and you start going to the different cities every week and we traveled quite a bit, and learning that every time we go to a city, we're making not only an economic impact but we're also making a charitable impact. Being able to be a part of that and witness what you're doing in each of those communities was so tremendous that that is why we started our foundation. We wanted to do the same. We wanted, on top of that, what else can we do.

So it is amazing to come to communities like this and to be able to introduce new charities and to be able to have that hands-on feel knowing that every ticket you buy, every sponsorship package, everything that you're doing that is going back to a charitable organization.

So it's really, it's a great legacy to leave.

But like Billy Horschel, he was like, I love what the Furyks are doing so now he started a foundation. Just knowing that that is continuing on the Tour and in our communities, it means a lot to us.

Q. Miller, do you think Tiger's going to play next year? Just kidding.



MILLER BRADY: Why did I know you were going to ask that question? Ask Jim.

Q. I had a question for you, Adam. If you could kind of -- what would be the difference in the number of volunteers you need here compared with Timuquana and where do you expect to draw from, what area, volunteers and fans? How is that going to be different?

ADAM RENFROE: That's a great question, one we've given a lot of thought to early on in the process. We operated with about 600 volunteers at Timuquana Country Club and we certainly envisioned needing a few more here just to get players, fans around the golf course.

I don't think we'll have any issues in identifying those volunteers. We mentioned how enthusiastic the membership was earlier. We're confident that we can put that opportunity in front of the membership and get any numbers that we want. It's a balance. If volunteers want to be involved, we want them to be involved with the tournament and we'll create opportunities for them to be here.

I think from a fan perspective, we looked at the growth of Palm Coast over the last decade and saw substantial growth, so I think we've got a built-in audience right here in Palm Coast.

I think getting to Palm Coast gets us access to a Daytona market, an Orlando market, we can pull from surrounding markets. So Miller mentioned it earlier, we do feel like we have a greater opportunity to bring fans in to experience this event. The music aspect of the tournament is so important. If we bring a big named concert act in, I think that adds to the experience of tournament week.

All the things we thought about, thank you for the question, there's no hesitation on our side from a fan or volunteer perspective.

Q. For Jim, having gone to the other side from a player now as a tournament host, has there been anything that surprises you, impresses you about the running of an actual tournament?

JIM FURYK: I think that it takes an army. As Adam talked about, 600 volunteers. Adam's done a wonderful job as our tournament director. Year one I poked my head in the office six times a day just to see what was going on. I'm not sure you saw me this year. He does such a good job. I worry about playing more than I worry about the event itself.

Yeah, I think the amount of time an organization, we have a wonderful -- these events are run by small teams. A Korn Ferry event or Champions Tour event usually has an office full of about five or six people.



We have an amazing team, very small. They have to wear a lot of hats and I think I'm impressed by the amount of work that it goes into for about 12 months to then culminate in one week and have everything go off smoothly is quite impressive.

Yeah, just I think what we've tried to do. Tabitha and I traveled, she traveled with me full time for most of my career and we had our favorite events, we had our favorite venues, favorite golf courses, favorite cities. We tried to kind of pick the things we loved about every event and then tried in a little some sort of way incorporate that into our own tournament and kind of give it that family like feel.

So I guess what I'm impressed by most is how small our team is, how hard they work and then the support we get from our community. When you say we have 600 volunteers, the support we get from our community with the fans showing up when you get 8,000 to 10,000 people at the golf course is just incredible.

Q. For Brad, please. This place has been here for a long time and Nancy Lopez helped put Palm Coast on the map 30 years ago or so. What does bringing an event like this mean to your corporate leadership and Carlton in trying to amplify the good of Hammock Beach?

BRAD HAUER: Well, like I mentioned before, when we get the nod to host a PGA TOUR Champions event and especially the FURYK & FRIENDS, Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS really validates the property, it really screams loud and clear that we are very unique property in Florida. We're basically Florida's ocean golf course. If you want an ocean golf experience, I don't know how you beat the Ocean Course here at Hammock Beach and having a Jack Nicklaus signature designed course behind that.

So for myself and Carlton and the whole team here, to try to describe the level of excitement we have for this event, it's hard to put that together.

Many of us were here back in '07, '08. We understand what the exposure, the national exposure that this event brings not only for Hammock Beach but for the beautiful county of Flagler County, 18 miles of coastline that it's very tourism driven. The impact for our entire community is very meaningful, for sure.

Q. For Jim and Tabitha. Two things. First, what was your favorite event, because it might not be the same for each of you?

JIM FURYK: On the PGA TOUR?

Q. Yeah.

JIM FURYK: I think we're going to say the same thing. Mine was always the AT&T, but a lot of personal reasons behind that. Loved Pebble Beach. We got engaged in Carmel during the U.S. Open in 2000.



So I think from a community standpoint, from renting a home, walking the streets of Carmel, having kind of a date night every night, that was the place I started my season almost every year in February, it was my favorite event really because we got to kind of hang out and be together.

TABITHA FURYK: So I would say the Memorial because that's actually where we met. We wouldn't have those strolls if it wasn't -- just kidding.

The Memorial's really special. Jack and Barbara Nicklaus have a special place in our heart. They've been phenomenal to us. When you talk about a mentor or somebody to follow and the great things that they've done for charity, you couldn't pick a better couple to be able to emulate and we've been blessed by having such wonderful experiences at the Memorial.

Yeah, when Jim won in '02 I was literally about to pop with our daughter, and yeah, a lot of special memories there at the Memorial.

Having them and their personal touch for every player and how they embraced everyone that came in to make them feel like they were at home there is really special. That's a lot -- that has a lot to do with what we do when we invite the players and their families. We want them to come here, feel like they could ask us for anything, make them feel comfortable, warm and a little bit spoiled.

Q. That leads in perfectly to my next question then. What's the biggest compliment that you guys can get or have gotten from our players that have been at your event?

TABITHA FURYK: I think just the strength of the field really speaks to how much they respect Jim and what a great player he's been over the years and what a great friend he's been to them, and having those guys come back year after year.

And I think one thing that blew me away our first year was Davis Love said, I'm going to play. Great, appreciate that. And he said, but I want to play in all the pro-ams. I know that I can make a special impact with your sponsors so I'll play in both.

And then Freddie's like OK, well, I'll do that if he's going to do that. And David Duval.

So they all are just very selfless in trying to do anything they can to help us give back and I think that's pretty special and speaks to the person that Jim is.

JIM FURYK: I think Tab hit the nail on the head. We want them to feel spoiled. We want the food to be amazing, the courtesy car, accommodations, the golf course. I don't know if there's just one.

Honestly, it means so much now, just little gestures. When someone comes up after an event, tells you how great it went, thank your staff, it was amazing, this is one of our best



events on Tour, this is my favorite event. Hearing little things like that makes you feel so special and makes me want to reach out to the folks that when you enjoy your time to make sure you say something really quite nice as well.

So there's not really one particular thing other than it means so much when one of your friends reaches out and tells you how nice the event was. It's something I want Adam to hear and Tabitha to hear and all the folks in our family that puts the tournament on.

Q. Just as a follow, and I don't want to take this the wrong direction but U.S. Open is said to be the toughest test in golf that requires your utmost attention and you got engaged during that week?

JIM FURYK: Yes, we did.

Q. Could you not wait until it was over?

JIM FURYK: Well, I won't bore you with the details but I carried that ring for about three months and I just couldn't take it anymore. Tabitha loves the beach so -- and we love Carmel, so I figured what better spot. And yeah, I squeaked by and I think I barely made the cut.

Is that the year I think I played by myself on Sunday? You can play Pebble Beach by yourself in a U.S. Open in two and a half hours and shoot 75 and be at Katy's 20 minutes later eating breakfast.

Q. What day did you get engaged? What day did you propose?

JIM FURYK: Early in the week, it was probably a Monday night or Tuesday night, somewhere in there.

TABITHA FURYK: It was Tuesday night, and then I quickly texted all my friends and we did an engagement party the next day, a little lunch at one of the local shops and had pizza and wine. it was, hey, guess what? Didn't see it coming.

Q. You played with Tiger the first two rounds, did you not?

JIM FURYK: I did, yeah. He had a little better week than I did. Actually, he didn't, I had the best week but on the golf course he did.

Q. Nice save, nice save. Good up and down.
