Q. Taylor, win number three for you on the Korn Ferry Tour. Just how does it feel?

TAYLOR DICKSON: Oh, man, it's unbelievable. If you would have told me I won three times on the Korn Ferry a few years ago, I probably would have thought you were crazy. It's just a surreal feeling and I couldn't be more excited.

Q. You know how tough it can be out here. 72 holes bogey free, only second person to do it and win. Just what does that mean to you, just being in that company?

TAYLOR DICKSON: I mean, it's unbelievable. I think the other guy's Chan Kim, right?

Q. Um-hmm.

TAYLOR DICKSON: So just to be in a category with him is cool because he's unbelievable at golf. Yeah, 72 holes with no bogeys, not what I envisioned happening, but it's nice when you don't go backwards.

Q. Having your wife here this week, having her here for the win.

TAYLOR DICKSON: Oh, it's unbelievable. She's the reason I'm here. I've had a tough last half of '25 and she's been my rock. I couldn't do anything without her, there's just no way. She's seen me in the highs, the lows and I'm just so happy she's able to see it.

My family wasn't here for the first two, one was down in Chile, and then Wichita, I was playing not great golf either going into that so I told them there's no need to fly out and watch me, and then I win, which is golf.

So no, I'm just so excited, happy she's here. We're going to have a good dinner and we're going to have a good time.

Q. After winning, you pointed to the sky. What's going through your head?

TAYLOR DICKSON: Oh, man, it's for dad. Yeah, it's crazy. He got to see it all. I couldn't be happier.

Q. What did he do for you in your golf journey?



TAYLOR DICKSON: He just supported me. It's funny, he was the highest handicap at our club and I was the lowest. He played like once a year. So like if I would get it off the ground he thought it was unbelievable. But we're doing more, so it's good.

Q. Earlier in the week we did talk about some stuff over the offseason you worked on and your unique setup's been talked about a lot.

TAYLOR DICKSON: Oh, yeah.

Q. In your time on the PGA TOUR, did you ever consider adjusting that or did you just stay true to what you were doing the whole time?

TAYLOR DICKSON: No, I can't, I can't switch it. I've tried. If I try to hit a ball with it right behind the club, I'd be a 10-handicapper. It's unbelievable, so no.

Luckily, the new coach I have, Jeff Pierce, he doesn't want to change it either, which I wouldn't really let anybody change it. I can't stop it. It works, why stop.

Q. Can you talk a little bit about the strategies you utilized coming into the tour?

TAYLOR DICKSON: Yeah, just over the offseason I was working on my wind game honestly, fighting the golf ball, was not very good the second half of last year. So I knew coming into the Bahamas, it gets windy so I had to work on that and we did a good job of it.

Q. And how was it playing here in the Bahamas?

TAYLOR DICKSON: Oh, it's unbelievable. It's like 30 degrees in Charlotte where I'm from, so happy to be here. The fans were incredible, the people here are awesome, and now I get to enjoy it. It's been a work week all week and now I get to go and have some fun.
