

MAX GREYSERMAN (-8)

Q. Max, you've got to be happy with that opening round. I know the finish wasn't what you wanted but still pretty comfortable for you. What did you do out there today especially?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Kind of did most things well. If you're going to shoot in the low to mid 60s around here, you've got to do a lot of things well.

Putter speed was good, iron play, wedge play was solid, a little leaky off the tee at times with the driver but nothing too bad. You've really got to take advantage of that North Course out in this tournament. I think I saw a stat last week that the lower you shoot on the North Course, it gives you a big advantage obviously because the South is tougher.

Q. When you see the tee times and you see you're on the North Course first, I mean the weather looks good all week but is that something that you're comfortable with or would you rather do it the other way around?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, I guess it's nice to kind of play the South consecutively. Honestly, I didn't even know I was playing the North until my caddie told me last night. I get a text with tee times, I didn't even look at it. Usually Wednesday night I ask my caddie when am I playing. That's kind of how it went. I kind of do like that, sort of maybe like the AmEx too where you play two in a row on the Stadium, I like it.

Q. What was the highlight out there for you today?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Drove the green on the front nine on 7. I would say anytime you're pin high with a driver on the green, that's going to be pretty good on a par 4.

Q. Your approach this season, you played remarkably well the last couple years, like five runner-ups I think. Your approach this season, how important is it for you to get in the mix every week and try and get that win?

MAX GREYSERMAN: Yeah, that's pretty much all you play for, so that's the No. 1 thing on my mind when I get to the golf course every week at the start of the week so that's pretty much my only focus on the golf side of things.

Q. Looks like last year after Detroit you went into a little bit of a rough patch, but then since then you've been playing great again. Is there something that happened in that period?

MAX GREYSERMAN: That's just golf, that's ebbs and flows of golf, any sport really. Unless I guess you're Scottie Scheffler, you have up and down weeks.

Pretty pleased with some of the equipment changes I've made this year relative to last year. I think getting some momentum off the tee, which is what I struggled with last year, I think that will be key for me for the rest of the year. I've got to be patient. It's a long year. I didn't have a great week at AmEx last week, but that doesn't determine the year. And I'm going to be playing 25 plus times, there's plenty of opportunities to play well and hopefully get a win.
