SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER (-11)

Q. Scottie, just your overall assessment of the week as a whole?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Yeah, I mean, I think after Thursday I did some pretty good stuff, yeah.

Q. Was it as --

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I don't really know how to elaborate on that. I think I was in dead last after Thursday, battled just to make the cut and think I had two solid dates over the weekend, yeah.

Q. Was there anything just specific that really improved the last maybe even like couple days?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Not really. I mean, I think going out early yesterday, the greens were a lot fresher, got to see some putts going in. When we went out on Thursday, the wind was blowing so hard and the greens were so bumpy and so fast, it was a complete crapshoot whether or not the ball was going to get in the hole. In order to get the ball to go in the hole you had to hit it with a little bit of speed to negate some of the bumps, and if you hit a putt with speed, you had another three-, four-footer especially with how much pitch is on these greens.

So it was really challenging going out there starting the way we did on Thursday and then I start off the way I did, maybe press a little bit or whatever it may be. After that, I did a lot of solid stuff.

Q. This last week about (inaudible) kind of being, having a lot of pride in fighting back and putting yourself in contention to win, obviously not quite the case here, but 11 under on the weekend showed form, like are you still finding some of that satisfaction and grinding back higher up?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I mean I've never been one to quit so it's not really -- I mean, I'd feel pretty silly to quit in a PGA TOUR event. Overall, being out here and competing, that's what I love to do and, like I said, got to go out early yesterday on some fresh greens, get a little bit less wind. It's easier playing in the morning than it is late in the day. Took advantage of it. Then I had another solid day today.

Q. This is a tough stretch playing Phoenix, Pebble and here all back together. What do you hope to kind of reset or refresh once you're done with this tournament?



SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I think it's a good stretch of golf. You've got some different challenges that you see. You look at a week like Phoenix where everything's firm and fast and you immediately flip over to Pebble where it's cold, it's wet, the greens are super soft, very slow, quite bumpy as well. It's just a completely different style of golf.

I think that's one of the good things about playing on the PGA TOUR, you see so many different types of test, and you come to a week like this where it's another new grass, instead of being soft and slow, they're soft and fast so it was challenging.

Q. You said earlier in the week golf is frustrating for anybody who played it, including you. I'm curious as you've won more, has your, I guess, threshold of what you get frustrated by risen or lowered as you think about your game?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Not really. I think, nah, not really. I try not to focus too much on the results. I focus on how I feel, stuff like that, no, no.
