**DOC REDMAN (-19)**

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**Q. Doc, it's been a long time coming. You've been close two, three times, a few top 5s. What does it mean to win and to win in this fashion?**

**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I think it means the world. It's been a long time coming, like you said. I've worked really hard and kind of through the ups and downs of it I had a lot of support from my wife and from my family. To finally kind of really believe in myself and then have this happen, I think it's a lot of satisfaction and I can have a lot of confidence going forward.

**Q. It took 177 PGA TOUR-sanctioned starts between the PGA TOUR and the Korn Ferry Tour.**

**DOC REDMAN:** Right.

**Q. That's a lot. That requires patience. It's been a grind, it's been a struggle. Tell us about those struggles and not losing faith and keep grinding for it.**

**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I think I have a lot of really good experiences from those 177 golf tournaments. I think for a while the last thing that was missing was just believing in myself. I've done a lot better with that recently. I knew I was good enough, and sometimes you can lose faith a little bit when it's been so long and you haven't seen the results like that. So I'm just really happy.

**Q. Yesterday you told us that you will go out and try to make as many birdies. Got off to a birdie-birdie-birdie start, which was very good to get the juices flowing, and then you kind of cruised to it with four birdies halfway through the round. Take us a little bit through your round, what was going through your head and then the big lead that you were able to build.**

**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I guess I never really looked at the leaderboard. I knew what Davis was doing obviously, but I was prepping all night to start out hot like that if I could and then to just do the best I could and add it up at the end. I knew that if I did that, someone would have to shoot really low, but I also wanted to have kind of my best day of the week and try to run away with it as well and win by as many as I could.

**Q. Eight through 12 was the key moment. Take us through that part of the round.**



**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I think it was a little rough there in the middle of the front nine. I didn't really do anything wrong. I think there's a lot of tough holes out here, but I knew that there was wedges coming and opportunities, so I just kept believing. Was able to hit really nice wedges four times, I guess, and make the putts. That was really cool.

**Q. You ended up having a couple of bogeys late, but how nice was it to walk 18 having that comfortable lead, being able to enjoy it and have your moment?**

**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I think that was amazing. Makes this hole a lot easier to not have to make a putt or do a birdie. I guess I would have been prepared to have to do something crazy, but then after 17, to see that I had plenty of strokes to go and I could just go wedge, wedge and two-putt was pretty awesome.

**Q. You said like during your selfie, "To many more." This is hopefully the start of your rise back to the PGA TOUR. Tell me about that, making it back to the highest level.**

**DOC REDMAN:** Yeah, I think that's what we're all dreaming of here. It's as competitive as it's ever been, especially down here. I think that's a really cool thing and a nice challenge that we have. I think if you can win in this event or any event on the Korn Ferry Tour, I think you're ready to compete against the best. So I'm ready to go try and win some more and see how good I can get.

**Q. One last one on Chile. Today, a lot of fans. How cool was it to have that big crowd following you there at the end?**

**DOC REDMAN:** Oh, it's amazing. The crowd was really nice, they were clapping for both of us. It's cool to have 20 people following you let alone as many as we did. So it was really awesome for them to come out and support us.
