BERNHARD LANGER: I'll tell you afterwards, I haven't experienced it yet.

Q. Does it feel weird though inside?

BERNHARD LANGER: I don't know what it's going to feel like until I get there, but I think it will be bittersweet.

BERNHARD LANGER: I hope so. Usually is. Good stories, great company and good food. What else can you ask for?
