JEREMY GANDON (-22)

Q. Jeremy, talk about what made the difference for you out there. Obviously you had a great finish but you played solid all week. What was it about your game that really made the difference for you to hang on and win this thing?

JEREMY GANDON: I think I played well on the easy holes. This course, it's a really good course because you've got a few easy holes and a few hard holes where you just need to just par is a good score. Yeah, I think I did a good job playing good on the par 5s, the short par 4s and that put me in good position down the stretch at the end.

Q. You had a great round yesterday to get yourself tied for first place heading into today with Ian Gilligan. How did yesterday go for you and what was that turnaround like for you coming into today's round?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I shot 6 under yesterday and I can't remember the rounds, but yeah, it was a good round yesterday because the wind was blowing a little bit at first. Yeah, same thing, I did a good job on the par 5s and then today was just kind of keep the same mindset. I knew if I would be a couple shots behind or in front or just a couple shots the last three, at least I would have a chance and that worked out for me.

Q. Talk about you look really solid in the points standings now especially after winning this. You're in good shape coming in. You've got to be feeling good about the rest of the season and looking towards next year.

JEREMY GANDON: Oh, yeah, man, it feels great. Winning feels amazing.

Then yeah, I'm not going to go into the math but I missed by a few points last year so I kind of know the number and what I need to do from here. It's still early in the season. I'm playing good golf, so most important is just kind of keep the momentum going.

Q. After Club Car, with this now being your second professional title, how's this one compared to the first?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I mean, the first is hard to beat, but that one's pretty special. My wife was here. Yeah, I mean, I don't know how many more or, you know, how long I'm probably going to play golf, so I'm going to just enjoy it and celebrate it with my family. Yeah, it's awesome.



Q. I know you touched on it a little bit earlier, but to birdie those last three holes to get in the position of walking up the 18th green knowing birdie could win this thing for you, just how did that last stretch go to kind of get yourself in the winning position to begin with?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I wasn't putting my best today. I was hitting it good. I had a few opportunities that didn't go in through the round. Yeah, three-putt on 15, that kind of put me 19 under. Then yeah, the momentum switch was probably on 16 where I hit it three feet, hit a good putt right in the middle and that kind of propelled me to do what I did on the last couple. Augusto actually was right behind, he kind of gave me a good line on 18. That's kind of what I read, but it's always goes to see what the ball's going to do right before you putt it, especially in that fashion.

Q. How aware were you of where you stood on the leaderboard on 16 tee?

JEREMY GANDON: On 16? Well, so I saw on 15 after I three-putted, I saw that I was -- I think I was only one shot behind. I can't remember. Well, I knew going into 17 that I needed to make at least one birdie. Then I heard the crowd when Jay had an opportunity to make birdie and like it sounds like he missed it. Sounds like 21's the number. Yeah, just wanted to have a putt for it on 18 and that worked out.

Q. Are you and Mitchell and Jay, I think you guys had some crossover together on Latinoamerica or those tours. How well do you know those guys?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, Jay, not too much. Mitch, I know him very well. I played Latin and probably two, three years I was there when he had his amazing year. He won the money list by a billion points without winning a tournament so that was pretty impressive. Now we actually play at the same club at Dallas Athletic Club. He's a good friend of mine.

Q. Just thoughts on the outlook on the rest of the year now. I know you talked about how you won last year, didn't finish with your card. What do you think you're going to need to do the rest of the year?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, same thing that I was just saying. I know the number and yeah, at the end of the day I just want to keep the momentum going. I'm in good shape right now, and it's a start in two weeks where it would be nice to -- I actually like the course coming up. Hopefully I can keep playing well coming up.

Q. Were you nervous over the putt on 18?

JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I was nervous from, you know, hole 14 to -- the whole course I was nervous.

Q. What do you do to manage the nerves?



JEREMY GANDON: Yeah, I mean, it's not easy, but you're just trying to always come back to the present moment, I guess, and like the shot that I had to hit. Yeah, I mean, that's all I was trying to do. I also (inaudible) putt on 15 right before that. Yeah, just needed to keep going and it turned out better at the end.

Q. What's the coolest part about winning?

JEREMY GANDON: I don't know. I mean, I guess it's good to celebrate with the family, that's pretty important. Then yeah, it's just, yeah, it's a job and put a lot of hard work in it. Been playing golf all my life. Yeah, it's just kind of a reward that when I'm late for dinner or, you know, it's not the only thing.
