LUCAS GLOVER (-13)



Q. Lucas, you follow the opening 63 with a 64. How would you compare those two rounds?

LUCAS GLOVER: Pretty similar. I putted very similar. So I was probably in the fairway a little more today. The holes were in the high spots because of the weather, couple places it was hard to get it close. It was a little bit nasty this morning when we started, had some rain through the first few holes. Yeah, played nice, solid, no bogeys through two days. Need to keep that up. Yeah, scores are going to be low so keep the pedal down.

Q. How different is the golf course from yesterday with the rain overnight?

LUCAS GLOVER: Not near as much runout in the fairway as you would expect. Not as much runout in the fairways so some longer clubs in. The greens weren't crazy soft. They were soft, but it's not like we were ripping wedges off the green or anything. Course drains unbelievable. I think the fourth fairway was the only one where I even had to think about casual, so course drains beautifully with all the rain they had, I think I heard 20 inches in June and then the last seven, eight days. It's good, they do a nice job here.

Q. Does the difference overnight change your strategy in any way did you feel today?

LUCAS GLOVER: No, no. I had a feeling it was going to be soft today just with the forecast and everything. Just stay aggressive. Came out a little early after the delay, make sure I had the speed of the greens. They were a tick slower, but nothing drastic. I was impressed with how the course played given what we had overnight.

Q. Three birdies each side, no bogeys. What was the highlight for you out there?

LUCAS GLOVER: I don't know. Best shot I hit all day was on 7, my third shot on the par 5, and I made a par. No, it was the third shot. I hit a flop shot that I thought was going to be perfect, it was the best shot I hit all day quality wise and it was really soft and went down there to 12 feet and I thought I hit it three feet. That was kind of a nice shot that didn't turn out as good, but it was one that could have gone wrong, too. I liked that one, it just didn't turn out how we wanted.

Q. Obviously with the hour delay was there any kind of dynamic that changed or anything that happens with that having to wait an extra hour to get out there?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yeah, I knew we were going to have one, but I didn't have the nerve to stay in my hotel.



I had just started my warmup in the gym, so I just stopped and just kind of laid around for 45 minutes or so on the mat and then started back. It was kind of expected, so it didn't change too much. We knew, kind of knew what was going to happen. Just you can't not be here in case we go on time. Yeah, I didn't hate the extra 45 minutes of just laying there, it was kind of nice.

Q. Looks like there's still a decent amount of people out here. What does that say about the area and fan base despite the rain and muggy, humid temperatures that they're still here?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yeah, I was impressed yesterday and today. Super hot and sticky today and the weather today, they're coming out and supporting the tournament, I think it's great. Obviously a lot of the membership here is out and watching and tons of kids. It's very cool, they're doing a heck of a job.

Q. William just mentioned he put his putter in boiling water last night to change up the mojo. Have you ever done anything like that in your career?

LUCAS GLOVER: No, I have not. He put it in boiling water. Huh, I thought it was a different putter. The other one looked black, this one was silver.

Q. Maybe the water --

LUCAS GLOVER: Maybe. I thought it was a different putter altogether. I didn't ask because he made everything, so I didn't want to mess up the mojo. I've thrown a few and kicked a few and broke a few, but I've never boiled one.

Q. He said he wanted to heat it up.

LUCAS GLOVER: Yeah, I get it. He did, it worked. So he might be melted by tomorrow.

Q. With that, like now -- how does it change your play or does it change when you have some other people in your group kind of climbing the leaderboard with you and pushing you in that way?

LUCAS GLOVER: Yeah, yeah, it's always nice. Max was grinding, he had a couple of mishaps there on the front but bounced right back, made a couple birdies on 7 and 8. William played great. It's always good for momentum when you're seeing good shots and seeing other people make putts. If you're down, it can kind of drag you up and drag you along. If you're up, it can kind of keep you going. Yeah, we had a good group. We had good fun and looks like we're all going to be around on the weekend.

Q. Are you scoreboard watching or do you just kind of not know what's going on around you? There are other people who are kind of going up the leaderboard with



you and do you take a look at that at all?

LUCAS GLOVER: Weeks like this week and last week, great example, basically all of them in the summer when it's pretty soft you've got to be pretty low to compete. You can look, but it doesn't matter, you've got to make birdies. There's not any hanging on. Guys are going to make birdies with summer conditions, just the way it is.

So yeah, I'm looking, but it's not for anything other than just seeing how my buddies are playing if I have any anymore, I don't know. They're mostly retired now that I think about it. Yeah, I mean, I know what's going on, but it doesn't change the mindset. It's pedal down because you've got to be low 20s every week all summer.

Q. Do you kind of have a preference with tournaments like this where you have to take it deep or ones where you have to grind to make pars?

LUCAS GLOVER: I've done well at both. Hard to really say. I've had more success the last few years on soft birdie-fests, but then in the past I've done well where you've got to make a bunch of pars. No real preference. I think it's just if you're playing well, you like any conditions, and if you're playing bad, it's the opposite, hate it.

Q. Obviously a couple years ago Wyndham, FedEx St. Jude you mentioned yesterday, you must like playing when it's hot. John Deere last week, then this week. What is it about when the temperatures rise, your game also follows suit?

LUCAS GLOVER: I have no idea. Maybe I'm looser, I don't know. I have no idea. I grew up in this stuff, so it doesn't bother me. I wish I had an answer for you other than I don't know. I just like it, I guess. Ball goes a little further and yeah, just seem to read the greens better. I don't know. Mostly kind of similar to what I grew up on.
