FRANKIE HARRIS (-22, won playoff)

Q. Frankie, first Korn Ferry Tour victory. How's it feel to be the winner?

FRANKIE HARRIS: It feels incredible, man. This is a feeling that I've been chasing for a long time. Honestly, I've never felt this way before about a tournament victory. Honestly, just the amount of support I've gotten over the last week I've been out here has been incredible. This is something I'll never forget for the rest of my life.

Q. And shooting 59 on a Sunday to do it, just what were the emotions throughout the round and was it something you were thinking about?

FRANKIE HARRIS: No, not at all, to be honest. I knew I was starting to heat up, I was feeling good over the putter. Started to see the lines real well, ball started to fall.

Once I made that eagle, I knew I was going to have something special going for me, and then continued to come in with two more birdies in the last three holes.

The thought of a 59 never even crossed my mind. Honestly, like 100 percent honesty, I did not know I shot a 59 when I made that putt on 18. I knew I was playing well, but I was just trying to keep the pedal on the gas and finish strong.

Q. You didn't know it was for 59, but did you know where you kind of were in the tournament at that point?

FRANKIE HARRIS: Yeah, yeah, I saw the leaderboard on 17 and I saw I had a three-shot lead. I was at 21 and they had fallen back to 18, so I still wanted to push for a couple more coming in and that's what I tried to do. I ended up making it happen.

Q. And what were those emotions? You have the excitement of the 59, you finish, and then Alistair coming up, creeping up --

FRANKIE HARRIS: Yeah.

Q. -- and you have to readjust and refocus, you might have to get ready for a playoff. What was that like?

FRANKIE HARRIS: I was ready to crack my first beer once I finished the round, but then



caddie and I made a smart choice not do that because Alistair came in real hot. Props to him for making four birdies in a row and shooting a 7 under on the back nine. Ended up going out there when I saw that he birdied 17 because I knew there was a good chance that he would birdie this one as well. Warmed up. He made a birdie, I heard all the cheers from the driving range, and I knew it was going to come down to a 1-v-1 playoff, so figured it was my time.

Q. Yesterday, before we got rained out, you were off to a really hot start and kind of came back this morning and in that third round at least couldn't quite get it going, I guess. What was that like this morning and then just regrouping for the afternoon?

FRANKIE HARRIS: Oh, this morning was incredibly frustrating, to be honest with you. To shoot 3 over after I was 5 under through six, still finished the round 2 under but it was extremely disappointing this morning.

I tried to clear my head, kind of get a refresh, restart on the day. Came out hot again, 2 under through four. Then eventually before I knew it I was 4 under through eight. Kind of just kept pushing from there.

Made a great par save on hole No. 11, I hooped an 18-footer to save par there. Birdied the next hole, which was 12. Putter started to get hot and I just figured it was my time to make it happen.

Q. Are you kind of -- are you surprised you have success this early? You were in school just a few months ago finishing up and it's kind of all new to you. Were you kind of expecting any of this or is it kind of all a whirlwind a little bit?

FRANKIE HARRIS: I have probably more high expectations than probably anybody in the game of professional golf for myself. I know how much talent I have, it's just finding the right time to put it all together and today was one of those ones where I felt like I did just about everything right and kind of put it all together. Today I proved to myself that I have it in me to be out here and compete with the best.

Q. What was the impact of the lightning delay this afternoon?

FRANKIE HARRIS: It was short lived, so it really had no effect. I went back out there.

Q. Where were you at that time?

FRANKIE HARRIS: I was in the middle of 14 fairway. I had just hit my drive when the horn went off and then I hit a pitching wedge to about 12 feet. Didn't have much effect. And eagled the next hole.

Q. Do you have any idea how many feet of putts you made on the back?



FRANKIE HARRIS: Quite a bit. I don't know.

Q. 153.

FRANKIE HARRIS: Really? I'm telling you, yeah, my ball-striking's usually my strong suit and today the putting finally clicked. So that's what happens I guess when I putt well because my ball-striking's usually pretty sharp.

Q. How does this now affect the rest of your season?

FRANKIE HARRIS: I'm going to keep pushing. I still have two weeks in a row now. This is my fourth week -- third week on the road. I'm going to go out there, maybe take tomorrow off if I have a big celebration tonight, but I will be grinding out there on Tuesday getting ready for next week in Boise, Idaho.

Q. Had your parents been to many tourneys before this?

FRANKIE HARRIS: Yeah, they've been to all of them. This is actually the first one they missed, so that's a little bit of a bummer. It's all right.

Q. Who greeted you after the round then? Who were those people?

FRANKIE HARRIS: That was my dad's cousins, who we're very close with. We do vacations with them every year and I've gotten real close with their children over the years. They actually came up to watch me at the U.S. Open also two years ago.

Q. What are their names?

FRANKIE HARRIS: It's Jack. Jack is my buddy, he's the young guy. Cammy is my dad's (inaudible). I really don't know. It's John, Cammy and Jack. I really don't know the relation.

Q. And you had missed the cut last week?

FRANKIE HARRIS: Yeah.

Q. So what was your thought coming in here?

FRANKIE HARRIS: Every week's just a new opportunity, a fresh start to go out and prove yourself. At the end of the day when you're teeing off on Thursday, everybody starts at even par so there's always a chance to redeem yourself and keep it moving.
