JACKSON KOIVUN (-8)



Q. Jackson, just talk about the week overall. Right now you're sitting at No. 70 in the FedExCup standings. Just have you been feeling that pressure throughout the day?

JACKSON KOIVUN: Yeah. I mean, at the end of the day I just didn't have my best stuff today and that happens. There's definitely some added pressure today, felt it coming down the stretch. Just tried to stay committed and make good swings. Just kind of didn't really turn out the way I wanted it to.

It's a pretty successful week except for today.

Q. Were you monitoring on the leaderboards or were you just kind of laser focused on what you were trying to do?

JACKSON KOIVUN: I'm the type of player who likes to know where I stand and I was definitely looking. There's a leaderboard on 15, 16, 17, 18 so I kind of saw what I needed to do. Didn't quite execute on some of the shots, but just got to wait and see what happens now.

Q. That was some of the most demonstrative that we've seen you so far in your PGA TOUR career. Just what were you feeling down the stretch?

JACKSON KOIVUN: It's just it's a different type of nerves when you know you don't have your stuff and you've got to go out there and execute some shots. I think that kind of sparked some emotion in me. Yeah, it's easier to get comfortable when you're playing well. It was just kind of a different feeling for me today.

Q. Certain pride if you're able to gut it out without your best stuff?

JACKSON KOIVUN: Yeah, for sure. Obviously I would have liked the score to be a little lower. I think I could have made a couple more putts and made some better decisions, but feel like I stayed in the moment, stayed present well and did the best I could.

Q. You had your best drive on 18 there with the pressure on. What would you say about that?

JACKSON KOIVUN: That was just one thing I was really proud of today was the drive on 18. It's a very risk-reward tee shot, if you hit the fairway you can get a wedge in your hand. Just hadn't hit driver good all day and to step up there and make a good swing felt really good. Hopefully it's enough.



Q. This is only your fifth start as a pro. Did you come into your first professional start like having any expectations or goals going into these few starts before the Playoffs started?

JACKSON KOIVUN: I mean, obviously I wanted to make the Playoffs and I knew that was a farfetched goal. If I told myself back in June that I would be sitting at 70 and waiting it out in Greensboro, I think I'd be pretty happy.

Q. I don't know if you're aware, but you actually will match a Tiger Woods record as having the fewest starts to make the postseason. What does that mean to you to be in company like that in the record books?

JACKSON KOIVUN: It's pretty cool. Obviously whenever you're in the record books with Tiger it's a good name to get acquainted with. Not quite there yet, so just got to wait it out.

Q. Are there any goals for the Playoffs? You're 70th, but what can you do?

JACKSON KOIVUN: Just have to go into Memphis, hopefully get there with a carefree attitude, get some good prep work in and try to keep climbing.

Q. Why was it so important for you to sort of tick off this goal, get in the top-70 and make the Playoffs?

JACKSON KOIVUN: At the end of the day it's kind of the season-long goal, to make the Playoffs. Obviously starting a little late is definitely a hiccup in the road, but to be able to be in this position's really cool.

Q. How would you assess your play the last couple weeks?

JACKSON KOIVUN: It's been solid. Looking back at my scores, I think I've scored it well, I've shot in the 60s a lot. But there's just been a couple moments in these past two weeks where the putter kind of got cold. It's just something I need to address and work on this offseason.
